She moved to New Zealand 16 years ago and put sailing on hold while she concentrated on surfing. New to surfing at 23, Lucy went on to win two National Titles in her age group short boarding and representing New Zealand on the world stage, surfing her sup for two consecutive years, contributing to Team New Zealand's Bronze Medal in 2017.

In 2018, Lucy turned her attention back to sailing, with a goal to fulfill a lifelong dream. Her first small yacht was a Farr 727, and after many exciting experiences, she upgraded to a Cavalier 30. Lucy has recently sailed her yacht to Nelson, where she will continue preparations for the race.

Lucy is new to ocean racing and this will be her first campaign. She hopes to join the fleet of experienced yachtsmen and learn a great deal from them while giving it her all to complete the race in a respectable time.
